





Valdarno



Valdarno Aretino is the part of the valley that extends over the upper course of the **Arno** river, a stretch of land which – due to its position – is often called the **heart of Tuscany**. Enclosed to the north by the imposing **Pratomagno** Massif and to the south by the ridge of the hills and mountains of **Chianti**, it offers an extremely varied landscape. From the **woods** that line the ridges of the mountain peaks, we pass to the **olive groves** of the mildest hills and the countryside colored in infinite shades of **fruit trees** and **vineyards**, up to the **natural reserves** born around lakes Bandella and San Cipriano.

All this adds to the unique landscape offered by **Balze**, high vertical walls with a mix of colors, interspersed with deep gorges, the splendid result of the erosion of the land once occupied by the ancient lake of Valdarno.

Land of **ancient trade routes**, it was strongly influenced by the bitter disputes for the territory between Florence and Arezzo in **medieval times**. As evidence of its historical past, today it preserves, scattered in its territory, **medieval villages**, **fortified towns**, **eighteenth-century villas and Romanesque parish churches** surrounded by greenery that preserve **valuable masterpieces**. In Valdarno, the phenomenon of "**Terre Nuove**", newly built urban centers that arose on the thrust of the Florentine lordship in the fourteenth century to increase the control of Florence over the surrounding territories of the earldom, always disputed with the historical enemy Arezzo, was particularly important.





To discover and learn about millenary art and culture in the heart of Tuscany

Valdarno is a territory that, even today, jealously guards and protects its essence. Its long history, to a careful eye, is still legible in many features of the territory.

It started long ago, before the appearance of man on earth, when a **large lake lapped the slopes of Pratomagno and Chianti**. Its retreat gave rise to the hills, the golden gullies of Balze, and the Arno river. During the **Classical Period**, Valdarno was first inhabited by **Ligurians** and then by **Etruscans** and **Romans**. The **Roman bridge of the ancient Via Cassia** is worth seeing.

But the most important chapter of this millenary history certainly was written during the **Middle Ages**: It is the period of **Romanesque parish churches**, **abbeys**, **feudal castles** on the uplands, and later of the **Terre Nuove** founded by Florence. All these places still exist and can be visited!

In Valdarno Superiore (Upper Valdarno), we can distinguish between the hamlets of the valley floor, along the course of the Arno river – **Monte-varchi, San Giovanni, Terranuova Bracciolini** (where, the famous fif-teenth-century humanist Poggio Bracciolini, was born and in 1417 discovered, in the Swiss Abbey of San Gallo, the *De Rerum Natura* manuscript by Lucretius) – and the towns located on the upland, such as (from south to north) **Pergine, Bucine, and Cavriglia** on the left bank of the Arno river, and **Laterina, Loro Ciuffenna, Castelfranco di Sopra, and Pian di Scò** on the right one.

A stroll in the beautiful historical centers of San Giovanni, Castelfranco di Sopra, and Terranuova will reveal their fourteenth-century origin as newly built towns: The orthogonal streets, the large regular squares, the municipal buildings in the center, the Florentine houses with the original portals magnificently preserved. *Terre Nuove* (New Lands) which are the result of the encounter between the great culture of the late Middle Ages in its full maturity – where the urban phenomenon was gradually replacing the feudal one – and the brilliance of the sculptor, architect, and urban planner **Arnolfo di Cambio**, which announces the imminent arrival of the Humanism. 10

Valdambra is a must-see destination, both from a naturalistic and cultural point of view, in the footsteps of the ancient medieval routes along which history, art, and devotion intertwine. We recommend a visit to **Badia a Ruoti**, a picturesque village dominated by the imposing Camaldolese Abbey of St Peter (Abbazia Camaldolese di S. Pietro) and **Badia Agnano**, an ancient Benedictine community that controlled numerous churches in Valdambra, Valdarno, and Valdichiana. Continuing towards the southernmost part of Valdarno, we reach the **Tower of Galatrona**, an imposing fortification of 26 meters, also known as "il Torrione". Just below the tower, the **Romanesque parish church of St John the Baptist (Pieve di San Giovanni Battista)** rises. But one of the greatest examples of Tuscan Romanesque is certainly the parish church of Gropina (**Pieve di Gropina**).

Another great example of medieval art can be found in the frescoes that completely and magnificently decorate the walls of the church of Santa Maria in Campo Arsiccio. Both churches rise not far from the route of Strada dei Setteponti, the ancient Via Cassia, as well as Vigna delle Sanzioni, a historic monumental vineyard dating back to 1936 and wanted by the fascist regime after the lifting of the sanctions that had been imposed on the Kingdom of Italy from the League of Nations following the imperialist invasion of Ethiopia. The regime wanted to transform a mountain into a living sculpture. Over one hundred people were employed for two years for its construction. A feat of effort and determination. But if you want to say that you have seen the true Valdarno, you cannot miss a visit to the Romito Bridge, or rather the last remaining of its four original spans that crossed the Arno river. Even today, there is an open debate among art historians regarding this bridge. In fact, some of them claim that this is the bridge appearing on the landscape on the right-hand background of the famous Mona Lisa by Leonardo.



Museo delle Terre Nuove

The heart of San Giovanni is the beautiful Piazza Cavour, crossed by Corso Italia, the main street. Palazzo d'Arnolfo, originally Palazzo Pretorio, overlooks the square, the center of political and civil power in the newly built late-medieval town. Over the years, Palazzo D'Arnolfo has progressively transformed its identity, and today it houses the Museo delle Terre Nuove (Museum of the New Lands), which tells the story of the constitution of the **new inhabited centers** that involved a large part of medieval Europe between the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries. A modern museum that, in an **immersive journey**, tells the history of a territory in the broader framework of Europe between the late Middle Ages and the Renaissance, making use of multidisciplinary contributions ranging from the history of civilizations to urban planning, without forgetting architecture and art history. The Museum organizes many activities, both for families with children aged between 6 and 10, which also include guided tours of the historic center, and for **schools**.



Museo della Basilica di Santa Maria delle Grazie

Behind Palazzo d'Arnolfo, on Piazza Masaccio, stands the beautiful Basilica di Santa Maria delle Grazie. You may share the amazement of every other visitor in discovering that the church rises on the mezzanine floor, which is accessed via two stairways that start from the porch.

The building, whose original construction dates back to the end of the fifteenth century, has been remodeled several times over the centuries: the large rotunda, e.g., was created in the late 1950s and replaces the previous eighteenth-century chapel destroyed during a bombing of the Second World War. To the side, the important Museum of the Basilica, an exhibition of sacred art that includes a collection of works, mostly paintings, from the Florentine fifteenth century, some seventeenth-century canvases and sacred furnishings such as silverware and liturgical vestments. But the main piece of the museum is the **Annunciation by Fra Angelico**, born Guido di Pietro (1395 - 1455). The great painter - friar, beatified in 1982 by John Paul II for his undisputed humanity, humility, and emotional religious enthusiasm, painted many Annunciations, but the three most famous are the one at the Prado museum in Madrid, the one of the convent of San Marco in Florence and this one in the Museum of the Basilica in San Giovanni.



Casa Masaccio

Valdarno gave birth to prominent personalities. Il Cassero per la scultura

The Cassero per la **scultura italiana dell'Ottocento e del Novecento** (Cassero for **Italian sculpture of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries**), housed in the historic premises of the Cassero di Montevarchi, is a unique project of its kind in Italy.

Its primary purpose is the research and documentation of Italian plastics of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, collecting and acquiring material on the sculptors of the period, setting up wide-ranging exhibitions. The permanent collection on display, entirely restored, consists of over half a thousand works including **bronzes, marbles, plasters, terracotta, wood, aluminum, and drawings**.

Accademia Valdarnese del Poggio

The main cultural institution of Valdarno – Accademia Valdarnese del Poggio – was established in **1805.** Its purpose, unchanged in over two centuries of history, is to **enhance the historical-cultural identity** of Valdarno thanks to studies of **scientific rigor** and the ability to engage through careful **dissemination**.

The beautiful academy building, an ancient Franciscan convent of San Lodovico, now fully restored, hosts the **Centro studi e documentazione del Valdarno Superiore** (Study and Documentation Center of Upper Valdarno), the **Museo Paleontologico** (Paleontological Museum), the **Poggiana library** and **audiolibrary**.

Museo Paleontologico

Its **collection of fossils** (over 3,000 finds including plant and animal fossils) has progressively been enriched with finds from the area. Do not miss the gigantic skeleton of **Elephas** *meridionalis* and the skull of the *Tigre dai denti a sciabola* (*Saber-toothed Tiger*).

Poggiana library

Since **1809**, the library has been collecting, cataloging and preserving the texts of the various disciplines concerning the territory of Upper Valdarno and of Tuscany more generally. The most prestigious is certainly **Fondo antico** (ancient fund), which gathers **incunabula**, about 300 **sixteenth-century editions** and printed editions from the **seventeenth-eighteenth** century, mainly of a religious subject. Among the library's assets, there is also an important Manuscript section, in which a valuable copy of Giovanni Boccaccio's Decameron dating back to the 15th century certainly stands out.

Poggiana audiolibrary

This audio library houses over **ten thousand copies of vinyl records and CDs** and covers the entire **history of music**, from its origins to contemporary music. The corpus is constant-ly growing and hosts often very **rare** musical **editions**.

Museo d'arte sacra della Collegiata di San Lorenzo

A small but very valuable museum set up in two rooms. The first houses objects of sacred art, illuminated manuscripts, reliquaries, liturgical vestments, and an imposing **golden cross** from 1522 by Martino Spigliati, a **pupil of Benvenuto Cellini**, who probably collaborated to its creation. The second room, known as the Della Robbia room, houses, among others, **Tempietto Robbiano**, an absolute masterpiece by **Andrea Della Robbia** dating back to the end of the 15th century.






Cavriglia




The millennial history of this part of Valdarno has been marked in the last 150 years by Lignite, a fossil coal used as a fuel for industry. The presence of lignite in this area has always been signaled by plumes of blue and smelly smoke that emanated from underground fires on contact between the lake grounds and the slope of the Chianti mountains, where volumes of lignite were released and caught fire on contact with oxygen. But it was only in 1860, with the new power needs to support the second industrial revolution, that the actual **mining** began. Thus, it turned out that the **Cavriglia lignite deposit was one of the largest in Europe**. The first twenty years of the twentieth century were marked by bitter workers' struggles that culminated in the strikes of 1921. Fascism put a tie to the worker, anarchist, socialist, and Catholic dynamism of the miners of Cavriglia, and in **1944** the territory paid a very high blood tribute just before the liberation by the Partisans and the allies. In July 1944, over 190 unarmed civilians were executed by Nazi-Fascist forces in retaliation. After the war, the Cavriglia mining site lost interest and the mining company began the phase of decommissioning, to which over 1,500 miners reacted with the self-management of the production site which lasted from 1948 to 1955, becoming one of the most important cases of worker self-management in Europe. However, the situation remained precarious until the "La Centrale" group proposed an industrial plan for the surface cultivation of lignite with on-site consumption of the fuel through the construction of a 250 MW thermoelectric plant. The surface excavation of the mineral began in 1956, while the thermoelectric plant went into operation in December 1957. In the afternoon of March 29, 1994, the last excavation machine still present was withdrawn from the lignite front and the extraction ceased forever. Since 2007, the plant has been converted to methane gas and is still operational.





MINE Museo delle Miniere e del Territorio

The **stories of a territory** indelibly marked by mining from a human, social, economic, landscape, and historical-cultural point of view are told in this **participated museum**, built with objects, documents and photographs donated by the **community**. The Museum is located in the now completely abandoned town of Castelnuovo dei Sabbioni, a dynamic mu**seum capable** of telling many stories to help us understand issues that are still current and controversial today. It is a one-of-a-kind place: It is the only museum that cannot physically take you to the mine, but is able to make you experience the mine through memories, images, sounds, and noises that a community has preserved over time to "donate" them to others.



Museo Venturino Venturi

The village of Loro Ciuffenna was the birthplace of the great twentieth-century sculptor **Venturino Venturi (1918-2002)**. In 1993, the Municipality dedicated to him this important museum which – thanks to a modern and well-finished set-up in large and welcoming spaces – tells the story and the work of the Tuscan artist through his significant production. The museum is organized in **seven rooms** that correspond to as many **thematic sections**, in a path of discovery and deepening in the human and artistic parable of the sculptor.

We recommend you to visit: the parish church of St Peter (**Pieve di San Pietro**) in **Gropina**, one of the highest examples of Romanesque architecture in Tuscany; the parish church of St Mary(**Pieve di S. Maria**) in **Scò**, framed by three splendid Romanesque apses; the parish church of **San Giovanni Battista** (St John the Baptist) **in Galatrona**, which houses the beautiful Robbiano Baptistery.
